Protecting Access to Medical Care is a Top Priority

Making health care more affordable and improving access the health care are priorities for Rep. Posey. Legislative initiatives that Rep. Posey has undertaken include:

- ✓ Improving Seniors' Timely Access to Care H.R. 3107 ends insurance companies' use of prior approval process to delay care.
- ✓ Protecting Those with Pre-Existing Conditions
- Opposes Changes to Medicare proposed by "Medicare for All" proposals
- ✓ Early Onset Alzheimers' Assistance through Older Americans Act services (H.R. 1903)
- Insurance Affordability H.R. 1398 repeals federal tax on health plans.
- ✓ Cancer Drug Parity Act (H.R. 1730) ensures equal access to oral cancer drugs
- ✓ Improving Colorectal Cancer and Bone Density Screenings (H.R. 1703/H.R. 2693)
- ✓ Lowering Prescription Drug Prices H.R. 1034 and H.R. 1035 cutting drug prices for all Americans
- Ensuring Continuity of Care by banning unnecessary STEP therapy (H.R. 2774)
- ✓ Ending Surprise Medical Bills (H.R. 3502)

Posey's Flood Mapping Reform Advances Through Committee

A reform measure by Rep. Posey was included in H.R.3167, the *National Flood Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2019*, which was approved by the House Financial Services Committee in June. Posey's proposal (H.R. 342, the *FIRM IT Act*) helps FEMA update floodplain maps by requiring the Department of Defense, U.S. Geological Survey, and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to share all their relevant maps for flood insurance purposes with FEMA. Posey noted that in many cases we haven't updated our floodplain maps in 20 years and that this proposal will help us do that cheaper, faster, and more accurately. "It's a win for both taxpayers and for the beneficiaries of the flood insurance program," said Rep. Posey.

Posey, White House Trade Advisor Discuss Approach to China



White House Trade Advisor Dr. Peter Navarro met recently with Rep. Posey to discuss regulatory and trade issues, specifically why addressing China was critical to both our long-term economic health and our national security. Posey has been an advocate for combatting overregulation and cutting burdensome red-tape which he believes hampers our ability to compete and causes American jobs to move overseas.

Aside from creating a more competitive economic environment here in the U.S., Navarro elaborated on the serious threat to our security that China poses as it has a <u>history of hacking our computers</u>, <u>stealing American intellectual property</u>, <u>forcing technology transfers</u>, and <u>manipulating its currency to give it an unfair competitive edge</u>. Navarro also noted that China is also the main culprit in dumping large amounts of fentanyl, an opioid and form of synthetic heroine, on our streets. Fentanyl is highly addictive ev en in small amounts. According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, in 2017, nearly 29,000 Americans died from an overdose involving fentanyl.

U.S. DOT Awards Grant to Replace Aging Space Center Bridge

The U.S. Department of Transportation announced a \$90 million INFRA Grant to replace the aging Indian River Bridge which is necessary for our growing industry to access the Space Center. The existing Indian River Bridge is near the end of its service life and very soon will not be able to carry space-bound or returning freight.

Last year Rep. Posey worked with the Florida congressional delegation, including Senator Marco Rubio, to pass legislation authorizing construction of a new bridge. In July, Transportation Secretary Elaine Chao announced the Agency had accepted Space Florida's application for funding to construct a new bridge. Posey supported Space Florida's bid for the grant and worked with the state's space agency to help navigate the process. "The Indian River Bridge is critical infrastructure to our space capability."

LAGOON UPDATE

House Passes Posey's Bipartisan Coastal Acidification Bill



The House recently passed Rep. Posey's bipartisan legislation, the *National Estuaries and Acidification Research Act* (H.R. 988), to fight coastal acidification and help estuaries like our Indian River Lagoon. This bill was introduced with Rep. Suzanne Bonamici (D-OR) and Rep. Brian Mast (R-FL), both fellow co-chairs of the Congressional Estuary Caucus.

The bill directs the Ocean Studies Board of National Academy of Science to conduct a study of the science of ocean acidification and its impact on our estuaries. Posey said the goal is to create a better understanding of coastal acidification so we can better manage and mitigate its effects on our nation's estuaries and other natural treasures.

On the federal level, Rep. Posey has worked with colleagues in Congress to advance bipartisan legislation that will support our national estuaries and improve the health of the Lagoon:

- Funding for the National Estuary Program: Led successful efforts in the House to reauthorize the National Estuary Program. Testified before both the House Budget and Appropriations Committees on the importance of the National Estuary Program. Secured funding for bipartisan plan to make more resources available to our nation's estuaries.
- Saving Stranded Marine Mammals: Restored funding for the Prescott Marine Mammal Rescue Assistance Program, which matches local funding to address manatee and dolphin strandings and deaths.
- Everglades Funding: Voted for passage of the Water Resources Development Act to fund the Central Everglades Restoration Projects (CERP) restoring the Everglades and the Lagoon.

Bipartisan Harmful Algal Blooms Legislation Signed into Law

Bipartisan legislation co-authored by Rep. Posey to fight harmful algal blooms was signed into law recently. The legislation reauthorizes important research programs and includes new tools to help communities prevent and combat future algal blooms and hypoxia events like the ones threatening the health of our Indian River Lagoon.

The legislation, now law, also strengthens the Interagency Task Force, increases collaboration among agencies and cuts through government red tape when it comes to harmful algal blooms and hypoxia forecasting. It also further recognizes that harmful algal blooms are events of national significance that will likely have detrimental environmental, economic, or public health consequences.

Committee Adopts Posey's Amendments on Homelessness

The House Financial Services Committee recently adopted two amendments proposed by Rep. Posey to fight homelessness and ensure fiscal responsibility. One amendment requires that homeless assistance programs prioritize funding for children who are homeless and ensures that no child falls through the cracks because of a technicality. Posey's other amendment, which was added to the *Ending Homelessness Act*, requires HUD to prioritize grants for communities which have enacted policies to encourage greater private-sector participation in providing housing for those with extremely low incomes.
