🚖 Congressman Posey's Legislative Agenda for Veterans 🚖



Increasing Economic Opportunities for Veterans:

- Improving the GI Bill Cosponsored the Harry W. Colmery Veterans Educational Assistance Act, which removed time restrictions to enable future eligible recipients to use their GI bill benefits for their entire lives. (Public Law 115-48)
- ✓ Jobs for Veterans Selected by U.S. House of Representatives to participate in the Wounded Warrior employee program to hire a post-9/11 wounded warrior.
- √ Transitioning from Military Jobs to Civilian Jobs Supported H.R. 2494 to establish the Veterans Economic Opportunity and Transition Administration to ease transition to civilian jobs.
- ✓ Expanding Secondary Educational Opportunities Supported H.R. 6376 and H.R. 6604 allowing part-time students to access VA Work Study programs and making it easier to transfer earned course credits between different schools.

Meeting Critical Medical Needs of Veterans:

- Combating Veterans Suicide Supported legislation (H.R. 4173) to require the VA to study the outcomes and effectiveness of the Veterans Crisis Line.
- ✓ Fighting Opioid Addiction Supported legislation (H.R. 3832) requiring medical providers at the VA who prescribe controlled substances to coordinate with state programs that monitor prescription drug use.
- Meeting the Needs of Surviving Spouses Ending the practice of reducing Survivor Benefit Program benefits by the amount received in Dependence and Indemnity Compensation. (Cosponsored H.R. 846)
- ✓ Increasing Access to Service Animals Cosponsored the Puppies Assisting Wounded Servicemembers for Veterans Therapy Act and Puppies Assisting Wounded Servicemembers Act or PAWS Act.
- Tracking Health Care Complaints Cosponsored and Supported H.R. 5754 Patient Advocate Tracker Act to create an electronic system for veterans to submit complaints regarding healthcare services they receive.

Improving the VA Experience and Protecting Veterans' Rights:

- Modernizing the Veterans Appeals Process Supported the Veterans Appeals Improvement and Modernization Act, which updates the appeals process at the Department of Veterans Affairs to allow for faster appeals decisions for veterans. (Public Law 115-55)
- ✓ VA Accountability Supported the VA Accountability First Act, giving the VA Secretary more flexibility to remove, demote, or suspend any VA employee for performance issues or misconduct.
- √ VA ID Card Cosponsored legislation signed into law enabling veterans to obtain identification cards from the Department of Veterans Affairs. (Public Law 114-31)
- ✓ Protecting 2nd Amendment Rights Supported H.R. 1181, the Veterans 2nd Amendment Protection Act to ensure that no veteran who utilizes a fiduciary will lose their 2nd Amendment rights without due process.
- ✓ Improving VA Transparency Supported S. 2687, the Strengthening Oversight for Veterans Act, to allow for more thorough investigations and reviews of allegations into VA employee misconduct.
- Making The VA More Responsive to Veterans Supported H.R. 7153 to require the VA create a five-year plan for modernizing information technology systems to provide more timely and accurate benefits to veterans and their families.

Fighting for Relief for Veterans Exposed to Toxic Substances

Congressman Posey has worked to extend healthcare and other veterans benefits to servicemembers who suffered exposures to harmful or toxic substances like Agent Orange and toxic releases from burn pits. In this Congress, Posey has cosponsored:

- ✓ The K2 Veterans Care Act establishing a presumption of service connection for certain diseases related to active duty at K2 Air Base in Uzbekistan.
- The Toxic Exposure in the American Military (TEAM) Act allowing veterans exposed to toxic substances in military to enroll in the VA healthcare system, create a process for the VA to establish a presumption of service connection for benefits, and advance scientific research into toxic exposure.

Protecting Military Communities from Forever Chemicals Like PFAS

We owe our military members, their families, and the communities that host them protection and remediation of the effects of these harmful forever chemicals.

- Original cosponsor of the PFAS Action Act (H.R. 2467) directing the EPA to designate PFAS a hazardous substance.
- Passed amendment targeting PFAS chemicals in drinking water and firefighting foam on military bases.
- ✓ Original cosponsor of the PFAS Free Military Purchasing Act (H.R. 4975).

Fighting to Secure America and Confronting China

🛧 Protecting American Patients 🛧

- ✓ Ending Tainted Chinese Pharmaceuticals Introduced the bipartisan Safe Medicine Act to end our reliance on China for lifesaving drugs and protect American patients from potentially contaminated pharmaceuticals.
- Reducing Blood Thinner Shortages Passed an initiative incentivizing the production of U.S.-based bovine heparin, reducing our dependence on potentially contaminated supply from China and addressing worldwide shortages.

🛧 Countering a Growing China



- Keeping U.S. First in Space Introduced the American Space Commerce Act which incentivizes companies to use U.S. launch services, countering countries that heavily subsidize their space programs like China and Russia.
- Curbing China's Influence in Our Space Program - Co-led effort creating an interagency task force to investigate Chinese interference within NASA.
 - Putting American Students
 First Passed initiatives to ensure taxpayer-funded, post-graduate
 STEM research grants are awarded only to American students and institutions.
- Bringing Jobs Back Home Introduced the RAMAct to provide tax credits to U.S. companies that bring manufacturing jobs back on our shores.
- Preventing Cyberattack Passed initiatives to strengthen our cybersecurity workforce and ensuring the Biden Administration secures our power grid from foreign adversarial governments, like China, with known histories of cyberattack.

🛧 Holding China Accountable



- Getting Answers to COVID-19 Pandemic Introduced the Prepare Act to get to the bottom of the origins of the pandemic and holding China accountable.
- Promoting Transparency Passed an initiative to make sure China plays by the rules and is transparent in international standards-setting bodies.
- ✓ Defunding Chinese Research Passed an initative to ban American research dollars from the National Science Foundation from benefiting state-owned enterprises like the Wuhan Institute of Virology in China.

Support for Military Sexual Assault Victims

Legislation to help victims of military sexual trauma recently passed the House. Congressman Posey supported H.R. 7335, H.R. 6064 and H.R. 6961 to improve communications, reduce bureaucracy, streamline the claims process, and provide increased training for VA benefits officials in assisting victims with military sexual assault trauma.

Blocking Funding to China's Research Programs

Congressman Posey co-introduced the Stop Funding Our Adversaries Act pushing back against the corrupt Chinese Communist Party (CCP) and promoting U.S. research initiatives by prohibiting any federal agency from using American tax dollars to conduct or support research with the government of the People's Republic of China (PRC).

The legislation protects the interests of the United States and makes sure CCP entities like the Wuhan Institute of Virology - which should be investigated as the likely source of the COVID-19 pandemic – never see a cent of American funding again.

Posey Fights DC Swamp to Successfully Restore **Honor Flight Police** Escort

The National Park Service has announced that it will resume U.S. Park Police escorts for Honor Flight

veterans to their memorials in Washington, DC. Last year the National Park Service cancelled U.S. Park Police escorts for Honor Flight veterans citing a further review of their policies. In January Congressman Posey co-led an initiative to force the National Park Service and the Department of the Interior to reinstate this service. The Honor Flight Network reimburses the Park Police for escorts. Posey has attended every Space Coast Honor Flight and said we owe so much to these brave men and women who sacrificed to keep us free.
