Dear Inspector General:

I am writing concerning troubling reports of alleged widespread election fraud in several states during the 2020 General Election and blatant disregard by the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) to launch any credible investigations. The citizens of the United States need assurance that a free and fair election occurred. Without a legitimate investigation by the DOJ and Inspector General, the outcome of the election results will be questioned by many Americans. Therefore, I urge you to fully investigate the DOJ's perceived desire to turn a blind eye toward alleged widespread election fraud. Allegations of widespread fraud have been laid out in numerous court filings. Which of these allegations were investigated and what was discovered?

In recent correspondence to Attorney General William Barr (enclosed), I have conveyed numerous concerns with the use of election software and hardware used during the election with which our nation's leading experts have found anomalies when analyzing the data from vote counts. For example, a clerk in Michigan reported the Democratic Presidential nominee beating President Trump by approximately 3,000 votes. However, after manually entering the results from printed tabulated tapes, the results flipped and had President Trump ahead by about 2,500 votes.¹

In addition to concerns over technology-based fraud, I have concerns that the DOJ has not pursued numerous issues from several states regarding the employment of "ballot-stuffing" on a widespread scale for the purpose of changing the outcome of the election results. In the State of Georgia there is a videotape of election volunteers pulling several suitcases from under a table that is obscured with a tablecloth after all the press and poll watchers left due to what was initially reported as a "water main break."² It appears that these suitcases contained thousands of ballots which were subsequently counted in the middle of the night when there was no one around to witness their troubling actions. This was all recorded by video camera.

These examples raise serious concerns relative to the legitimacy of our election results and need to be fully investigated to regain Americans' trust in our election process.

The reason for no investigations should not be because of a lack of resources or lack of interest. The DOJ and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) should put the same level of energy into investigating these disturbing reports of election fraud – which is the very foundation of our Constitutional Republic - as they did investigating an incident at a motorsports speedway in which it was determined that the source of concern was a garage pull cord and not a federal hate crime as was initially reported.³ It was reported that 15 agents investigated the speedway incident.⁴ To date there has been little reported regarding whether the FBI is even investigating election fraud in Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, Pennsylvania or Wisconsin.

As stated in my November 13th letter to Attorney General Barr, the best way to ensure confidence in our elections is through greater transparency. To instill such confidence, the DOJ, FBI and Inspector General must fully investigate all allegations of widespread and systemic election fraud. With such a closely divided nation, Americans need to be assured that their government is listening to their concerns and places a high priority on ensuring transparent and fair elections.
